We dedicate this issue to two cherished personalities who helped make Chesterfield what it is today



Louis Sachs: Community Builder

The points of engagement that define Chesterfield as a community are woven in a tapestry of businesses, homes, cultural amenities, restaurants, shops and green space. It is the vision of one man – Louis Sachs, who passed away in 2011. Sachs was the “Father of Modern Chesterfield,” creating a distinctive community in his 1,500-acre Chesterfield Village. Never hurried or rushed, Sachs diligently advanced a creation that today enriches lives on many different levels.

“Before people were talking about ‘new urbanism’ or sustainability, he was pioneering a new way of living by building connection points for businesses and residents through civic, cultural, retail and green space,” said Stephen Sachs, co-president of Sachs Properties. “We are committed to advancing that legacy and finishing what dad started.”

In 1967, Sachs began acquiring land in then rural Chesterfield to create a master plan for Chesterfield Village – one of oldest on record in St. Louis. It fostered “community” in subtle ways. Sachs named buildings and streets after local historic figures. He insisted on achieving just the right look, paying to bury electrical lines, purchasing and maintaining elaborate landscaping and building interior connector roads and three I-64 interchanges to connect to Chesterfield Village

Remarkably, Sachs used none of today’s common development tools – no eminent domain, no tax abatement and no tax increment financing.

Today, Chesterfield is the business and cultural hub of West St. Louis County. Chesterfield Village alone hosts more than 200 businesses. Sachs’ boundless generosity and enduring dedication to the arts helped the city of Chesterfield earn the “Creative Community Award” in 2011 from the Missouri Arts Council.

Indeed, Sachs invigorated his vision with a devotion to philanthropy and the arts. Quietly, he was a prime force in creating Chesterfield Arts in 1993. In 2009, he brought J Seward Johnson’s iconic “The Awakening” to Chesterfield. He donated office and retail space to STAGES St. Louis which opened a performing arts academy that instructs more than 1,000 youngsters, including those with special needs, in music and dance. Other beneficiaries: the St. Louis County Public Library – Samuel C. Sachs Branch, named for his father; the Sophia M. Sachs Butterfly House; Junior Chamber International; and the Seventh Day Adventist Church, YMCA, JCC and Faust Park.

Today, his vision of Chesterfield Village continues with the creation of the 200-plus-acre Downtown Chesterfield – an initiative that will ultimately connect all of Chesterfield.



Joan Schmelig: Community Leader

Joan “Joanie” Schmelig presided as President of the Chesterfield Chamber of Commerce for nearly 30 years. She was motivated, enthusiastic and determined. All of these characteristics are remembered and admired by residents of Chesterfield as well as other community leaders, Chamber staff, friends and family.

Since 1983, when Mrs. Schmelig accepted the position of Executive Director of the Chamber, it was her mission to develop this small community organization into the formidable source of business support and economic development that it has become.

During the flood of 1993, Joanie was instrumental in keeping the businesses and resi-

dents informed as to the status of the flood and thereby avoiding the full impact of the flood by organizing a communications network that in essence is still in effect today. She brought together developers and residents after the fact to work together to prove to naysayers that “Chesterfield’s best days still lie ahead!”

In order to raise funds to build four ball diamonds near Highway 40; Joanie held raffles, fish fries and carnivals. Today this is the site of the Chesterfield Athletic Association.

Growing the Chesterfield Chamber of Commerce was a labor of love. She founded and organized events such as Eggs and Issues Educational Seminars, Business After Hours, First Thursday Coffees, Leadership Chesterfield, Junior

Leadership Chesterfield, Business EXPO and Showcase, Job Fairs, Real Estate Forum and free Concerts in Faust Park to name a few.

When retail was beginning to boom in Chesterfield Valley, she worked tirelessly to bring needed workers to the area by arranging connector busses throughout the municipality.

In 1983 and again in 2010, Joanie received the Chesterfield Citizen of the Year Award and in 2009 was awarded the prestigious Excellence in Community Development Award from Progress 64 West. At that time, it was stated that “Joanie was an inspiration to all that had been involved in the evolution of the City of Chesterfield. She was chief cheerleader, facilitator and a mover and shaker; and a great friend and neighbor to all.”

In addition to being a great place to live, Chesterfield offers a prime location to conduct business. The city has more than 2,000 businesses, which employ more than 72,000 individuals. Chesterfield truly is a place where history, tradition, progress and family values have joined together as one to become a destination worth visiting. A thriving executive community operates out of Chesterfield Village, a 1,500-acre mixed-use, master planned development located in the city's urban core, while hundreds of light industrial and manufacturing firms situate themselves in the acreage of Chesterfield Valley. There are major corporations, modern medical centers, research facilities, major manufacturing companies and high-end retail stores that co-exist nicely with small family businesses and boutiques.

The vision of the City's future is continuously moving forward. Sachs Properties, the developer of Chesterfield Village, is building the new Downtown Chesterfield. Five separate pieces make up the cast aluminum sculpture which depicts a giant emerging from the ground. "The Awakening" is 70 feet in length and over 17 feet high, weighing 4,700 pounds. Something unique to this particular piece of art is that children and adults alike are encouraged to sit on it, jump on it, hide in it and climb on it.

Chesterfield truly is a masterpiece in progress. One doesn't need to look hard to enjoy the abundant beauty, imagination and creativity that is alive in every corner of this masterpiece called Chesterfield.

HISTORY *a proud*

Most cities grow from a single "named community"; not so with Chesterfield. Within Chesterfield's present city limits, there were once six towns/communities - each with its own post office. In addition, there were two other communities (Orrville and Centaur Station), on the western edge of present-day Chesterfield, that were also influential in Chesterfield's early development. One by one, post offices closed or transferred, until only the Chesterfield post office remained. As a result, Chesterfield absorbed the history of the people and the communities that once existed within its city limits. To appreciate Chesterfield's diverse and colorful background, one must look at the larger picture.

Bellefontaine (French for "beautiful spring"), or as the locals called it, "Hilltown," was settled in the early 1800s by the Bates, Conway, and Long families as a predomi-

nantly German farming community. The first post office was established as Bellemonte ("beautiful mountain") in 1851. Eighteen years later, in 1869, the town and post office names were changed to Bellefontaine. Rinkel's Market was a site for years, at the intersection of present-day Olive Street Road and Chesterfield Parkway, where Charlie Gitto's Restaurant stands.



The town of Lake started out as "Hog Hollow" some time around 1860. The post office was established as Hog Hollow in 1871, but a year later the town's name was changed to what some thought was a more suitable name of Lake. Zierenberg's General

Merchandise and Saloon (built around 1880) was a well-known landmark at the 18-mile marker on Olive Street Road. The original structure, destroyed by fire in 1918, was replaced with a brick building doubling as a filling station. Also within the building were a blacksmith

shop, saloon, ice house, weigh station and rooms for travelers in the upstairs area. The building stands today on the northeast corner of Olive and Hog Hollow, across from The Art Gallery of Hog Hollow.

The town of Gumbo was located near the current intersection of Chesterfield Airport Road and Long Road. This area is generally referred to as "The Valley" by locals and long-time residents. The name "Gumbo" is derived mainly from the soil, which although very rich and silty, when wet becomes a sticky, almost clay-like material. A substance very similar to gravel was made from Gumbo mud and used for streets and sidewalks in Forest Park during the 1904 World's Fair. Gumbo's post office operated from 1882-1907.

Monarch (earlier called Atherton, then Eatherton) was one of the settlements to spring up along the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Rail Line, when it came through the valley in the late 1800s. William Sutton's General Store stood on the northwest corner of Eatherton and Centaur Roads. The post office operated there from 1895 to 1907, when the mail was transferred to Chesterfield.

Bonhomme had a colorful life. (The name is French for "good man".) This small community, at the extreme western end of Olive Street Road, was close to the Howell's Ferry Landing. It boasted of a blacksmith shop, grist mill, store, post office and Fenn's saw mill; but all of it was washed away in the late 1800s by the Missouri River. Bonhomme was a popular name in St.

Louis County; with Bonhomme streets, roads, creeks, churches and townships still so-named. However, this Bonhomme is the only one that ever had its own post office, operating from 1851-1895.

Justus Post's Chesterfield, as a named community, dates to 1818. Colonel Justus Post arrived in the St. Louis area, along with wife, Eliza and

two small children on November 6, 1815. It is said he came here possessing an estate of \$12,000, mostly cash, and an IOU from the government in the amount of \$1,000 for services rendered during the War of 1812. St. Louis City proved to be good for social advancement but was not to Posts' liking. Within one year he again moved his family, this time to a 170-acre farm alongside the Missouri River in an area that would eventually be known as Chesterfield Valley. He paid \$14 per acre for this farm that included houses, barns, stables, a ferry and good cleared fields.

The Longs, Lawrence and William, arrived in 1797, settling on Spanish land grants. In 1816, William and Polly Long sold Post 400 acres, including their house. Justus Post would eventually acquire 21,204 acres, some

for as little as \$1.25 per acre. According to records, Post bought land by the mile. Post laid out the original community of Chesterfield, straddling Wild Horse Creek Road, between Baxter and Wilson. Wild Horse Creek Road was named Main Street, with North and South streets on either side. The cross streets were named Mulberry, Locust, Walnut, Prune, Vine, Chestnut and Oak. However, the town plat was not recorded until 1838. Post served one term as a Missouri State Senator and remained in the area for nearly 30 years before relocating to southern Illinois.

In 1877 (after the railroad came through the valley), Christian Burkhardt acquired 21 acres where Olive Street Road crossed the railroad. There he laid out Burkhardt's Subdivision, around Drew Depot. The original community of Chesterfield, founded by Post, gradually relocated to be along the railroad at Drew Station. Christian died in 1898, but

his son Edward and Edward's wife Lena continued this era of Chesterfield's evolution. Edward laid out Burkhardt Place, on the south side of Olive Street Road. He built a row of twelve quaint brick/tile bungalows in the 1918 to 1925 period. Edward also opened a mercantile store bearing his name and was president of the Farmer's State Bank of Chesterfield from 1914 until 1923.

The Farmer's Bank Building, (circa 1914), with its unique Mesker pressed-metal facade, is the oldest commercial structure in Chesterfield and the only surviving rural bank building in St. Louis County. It was acquired by architects Lauren Strutman and Dick Busch in 1999 and restored to its original glory. In mid 2000, it became Chesterfield's fourth property to be

listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Chesterfield Historical Commission has recognized this Chesterfield location as a historic district, with appropriate markers. The Farmer's State Bank building, which also housed the post office and telephone switch board, at the intersection of Chesterfield Airport Road and Baxter Road, along with the row of bungalows, and the nearby 1920s Slaughter House (now the Don Wiegand Studio), constitute what we can best see, touch and identify with as our city's heritage.

As previously mentioned, the community of Orrville had much influence on Chesterfield. Just south of Wild Horse Creek Road, along Eatherton Road (in what is now Wildwood), one can see a half-dozen of Orrville's original structures. John and James Orr came from Scotland. John's son, Robert, would become one of Orrville's leading citizens. He owned most of the land in town, was justice of the peace for six years and, along with his wife Laura, donated the land on which the present Antioch Baptist Church was built in 1860 (at 18319 Wild Horse Creek Road). The Hoppenberg-Fick General Store and Post Office, circa 1867, still stands. Robert Orr was the first postmaster (1858-1871). William Parks Bacon reportedly had the finest house in Orrville - it is still there.

Chesterfield's African American community (Westland Acres on Church Road), had its beginnings with the first Antioch Baptist Church, founded in 1841. At that time, white and black worshiped together. When the new Antioch Baptist Church was built in 1860, the African American community took over the original structure and re-named it Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church. Reportedly, African Americans worshiped at Mt. Pleasant until the 1920s, then gradually migrated to their present location on Church Road and built the Union Baptist Church in 1922.

Two events brought Centaur into being: the railroad and Anton Leiweke. In 1891, Leiweke, a deserter from the German Army, organized the Centaur

Lime Company and founded Centaur Station. The company employed about 100 people from 1891 to 1928, until it went bankrupt. Centaur Station was settled mostly by Germans. They established their own church (St. Anthony's Parish), first meeting on the third floor of Leiweke's lumber barn and later, sharing a one-room frame school house. This little congregation would later be the start of the Ascension Parish, now on Santa Maria Drive in Chesterfield. They built Ascension's first church in 1923-24; this structure is now named Godfrey Chapel. Howell Island lay just across the Missouri River channel from Centaur. In 1900, Anton Leiweke purchased the island, cleared it and began farming. He brought farmers and their supplies to and from the island by barge and a small vessel named "Honeybell".

One of the four structures in Chesterfield that is currently listed on the National Register of Historic Places, is Governor Bates' Thornhill. This building dates to the 1815-1817 period. The Governor Bates site was part of the first 98 acres donated by Leicester and Mary Faust to the St. Louis County Parks system in 1968. This was the beginning of Faust Park. Thornhill is the oldest standing Governor's residence in Missouri. Bates was Missouri's second Governor; serving while the State Capitol was still located in St. Charles. Bates died in

office of pleurisy at age 48, after serving less than nine months as Governor. He is buried at Thornhill Estate. Visitors to Faust Park may visit the historical site.

Among Chesterfield's architectural treasures are 20 homes over 100 years old. These "Century Houses" were recognized and their current owners presented with appropriate framed certificates at ceremonies held at Faust Park's Thornhill.

Chesterfield further preserves its heritage in the form of the Faust Park Historic Village, and the 1997 acquisition of the remaining 102 acres of the original Leicester Faust Estate. Chesterfield, beyond being one of St. Louis County's most successful and fastest growing communities, also has a colorful past; a past we can all explore and appreciate - by taking a few minutes to get off the beaten path.

Chesterfield's convenient location is supported with an extensive transportation infrastructure. While the 32-square miles of the city is cradled in a rolling green landscape of open valleys and landscaped developments, it is only 30 minutes from downtown St. Louis.

Interstate 64 East gives quick access to I-270 (the loop around St. Louis), which then provides connections to I-44, I-55 and I-70. Drivers can continue straight on I-64 East to reach other West County suburbs and also Clayton, the County seat of St. Louis County, or continue straight into the city of St. Louis. I-64 West provides access to St. Charles County, just across the Missouri River. There are seven interchanges off of Interstate 64 that provide quick access to major local streets such as Woods Mill Road (Highway 141) Chesterfield Parkway, Baxter Road, Clarkson/Olive and Long Road.

Chesterfield Parkway is the loop around the central business and shopping district, including Chesterfield Mall. Chesterfield Airport Road parallels I-64 in the western part of Chesterfield and is the access road for hundreds of businesses in "The Valley." Wild Horse Creek Road extends to the western boundary of the city and winds through rolling hills dotted with stately homes.

For out of town guests, there are a host of local taxis that provide prompt and courteous service, while many hotels offer shuttle service to Lambert Airport. Metro provides local and city-wide bus service, which connects to the MetroLink light rail system. Visit metro STLouis.org for more details.

I-64 East gives quick access to I-270, which then provides connections to I-44, I-55 and I-70. Continue on I-64 East to reach other West County suburbs and Clayton, or continue straight into the city of St. Louis.

The Spirit of St. Louis Airport, located at the western edge of Chesterfield Valley, is home to premier corporations and is a major reliever to Lambert St. Louis International Airport. There are several fixed base operators that provide a full range of support services including aircraft maintenance and sales, avionics, air freight and pilot supplies. Other services include flight training, charter aircraft, overnight hangar storage and tie down spaces and 24-hour fuel. Spirit is also a Port of Entry and has U.S. Customs and Border Protection on the field.

Industrial rail service is provided by the Central Midland Railway and serves industrial and light manufacturing firms in the Chesterfield Valley.

If you want to take a slower mode, Chesterfield partnered with Great Rivers Greenway and the Monarch-Chesterfield Levee District to create a trail system atop the levee in the Valley.

business & ECONOMY

At the heart of Chesterfield's growth is a robust economy bolstered by over 2,000 businesses and more than 72,000 employees working within the community, and annual consumer spending of over \$2.7 billion. This progressive city is proud to be the home of major corporations, high-tech research centers, modern medical centers and major manufacturing firms. Chesterfield also boasts a healthy base of family businesses and is a retail shopping destination in the St. Louis region.

Since its beginning in 1988, Chesterfield has grown from a small, rural farm area to one of the most successful, business-friendly communities in the St. Louis area. Meticulous community planning, an ideal location, abundant land, excellent hotel and

conference facilities, prime residential development and a well-educated work force (25 percent of whom have obtained graduate degrees or higher) have created a firm foundation for continued economic growth into the future.

Located along the I-64 technology corridor, Chesterfield is home to numerous offices and high-tech firms. New facilities con-

structed in only the past few years are quick to be occupied, leading to an average vacancy rate consistently in the low teens. Recently Chesterfield has become home to several medical facilities, including the Washington University/Barnes-Jewish Orthopedic Center, St. John's Mercy Rehabilitation Hospital and Chesterfield Medical Center. Home to top-rated St. Luke's Hospital, the community is becoming a destination for medical professionals and their patients.

Mercy Health has announced plans to construct a new corporate campus to include a virtual care center, outpatient hospital and their headquarters in the heart of Chesterfield.

Developers are currently competing to be the first to construct an upscale outlet mall, that will include over 200 stores and bring in thousands of new jobs. American Girl is a new addition to the Chesterfield Mall, their first Missouri location. Due to its central location in the region and impressive demographics, Chesterfield is highly sought after by retailers, corporate decision makers and health care providers.

CHESTERFIELD VILLAGE

Physically at the core of Chesterfield's thriving economy is Chesterfield Village – the first and largest master-planned community in metro St. Louis. Developer Louis Sachs, chairman of Sachs Properties, initiated Chesterfield Village in 1967. It transformed the far western reaches of St. Louis County into an affluent, vibrant mixed-use community that encompasses 1,500 acres.

With an expected completion date of 2020, Chesterfield Village has a projected cumulative capital investment value in excess of \$5 billion. To date, more than \$2 billion has been invested in its creation, including road improvements and, most notably, the three-mile-long Chesterfield Parkway loop. Chesterfield Village also has 2,600 residences in eight major developments that provide a variety of lifestyle choices – from estate homes to condominiums to apartments. Its exquisite landscaping and approximately 500 acres of green space define the community.



Physically at the core of Chesterfield's thriving economy is Chesterfield Village – the first and largest master-planned community in metro St. Louis.

At the nexus of I-64 and Olive/Clarkson, Chesterfield Village has an impressive array of low-rise and mid-rise office buildings with 1 million square feet of space and approximately 200 businesses. In addition, it encompasses the entire 1.3 million-square-foot Chesterfield Mall, with the 14-screen AMC Megaplex Theatre. This area is home to more than 170 retailers and 14 restaurants, including the upscale Bacana Brasil, EdgeWild, P.F. The community has attracted numerous top-tier corporations including Monsanto's Research & Development campus, one of Chesterfield top employers. Other key employment generators are Dierbergs Markets' corporate headquarters, AEP/River Operations Co., Rose International, and the Doubletree Hotel and Conference Center. The Junior Chamber International selected Chesterfield Village as the location for its world headquarters. In addition to accommodating the major corporations that make their homes here,

Chesterfield Village and its impressive Class A office space are ideally suited for the city's increasing base of "home-grown" companies, including engineers, architects, lawyers, financial planners, insurance agents, healthcare professionals and independent entrepreneurs.

Chesterfield Village will enhance its status as the civic and cultural center of west St. Louis County with the planned opening of STAGES St. Louis' new \$25 million theater and performing arts complex. Chesterfield Village is already home to the West County Family YMCA and its Chesterfield Community Theatre, the Jewish Community Center, the Samuel C. Sachs Library, Chesterfield City Hall, Chesterfield Central Park, the Chesterfield Amphitheatre and the expanded Family Aquatic Center.

The near future will bring the development of a premier planned community called Downtown Chesterfield, which will feature residential, business and shopping space. Sachs Properties, the developer of Chesterfield Village, is also developing Downtown Chesterfield. Located at Chesterfield Parkway West and I-64, this development will be adjacent to the 38-acre Central Park, Chesterfield Mall, the Samuel C. Among the many businesses and agencies operating in Chesterfield Valley are Aegion Corporation, a rehabilitator of public infrastructure; Mark Andy Inc., an internationally recognized manufacturer of printing machinery; Reliv International, a nutritional products manufacturer and distributor; Technology Partners, a technology outsourcing firm; JetCorp, a corporate aircraft charter and maintenance firm; and the Missouri Higher Education Loan Authority, or MOHELA, a student loan service. In addition to Chesterfield Valley's more than 200 restaurants and retail businesses, the 14-screen Wehrenberg Theater complex features one of the largest "mega-screens" in the region, and the Kemp Auto Museum is a

Both Chesterfield Valley and Chesterfield Village are positioned along the I-64 "high-tech corridor," which links Chesterfield to St. Clair County in Illinois and St. Charles County in Missouri. This roadway is the St. Louis area's main east-west corridor, and along it are located a majority of the metro region's technological and higher education facilities.



Owned and operated by St. Louis County, Spirit primarily focuses on business and general aviation and logs some 120,000 flights annually. It is the busiest business aviation airport in the Federal Aviation Administration Central Region (Missouri, Arkansas, Iowa and Kansas) and consistently is ranked among the top alternative airports in the United States.

Each day corporate jets from major corporations use the facilities at Spirit, and nearly every corporate jet arriving in St. Louis from another city lands at

this world-class facility. A number of fixed-base operators provide premier aviation service and support: Executive Beechcraft, TAC Air, Aero Charter, Midwest Aviation, Million Air and AVMATS.

SPIRIT AIRPORT IS WORLD HEAD-QUARTERS OF WINGS OF HOPE

The largest volunteer charity in the Midwest and the oldest and largest humanitarian aviation charity in the world, Wings of Hope provides the only free fully equipped medical transport, air ambulances and medical referral service. 



Since its very beginning, faith has played an important role in the lives of Chesterfield residents. Early 19th century traveling ministers planted the seeds for Chesterfield's religious community. Today, this community has grown to encompass more than 40 denominations. A host of houses of worship are either within or close to Chesterfield, including a Mormon Temple at Chesterfield's eastern border.

In addition to regularly scheduled services, many of these houses of worship offer such life-centered activities as childcare, Sunday school, summer religious study, singles activities, senior citizen functions, women's ministries and sports activities - not to mention a full range of charitable services to the community and world-wide.

Many area houses of worship emphasize the importance of the family unit and even organize "Family Nights" at the ballpark or other cultural events. 



The Levee Trail

Bikers, walkers and skaters can enjoy the great outdoors on an asphalt on top of the Monarch-Chesterfield Levee. The Levee Trail, developed by the Great Rivers Greenway District in cooperation with the City of Chesterfield and the Monarch Chesterfield Levee District, is part of the Missouri River Greenway. The north trail may be accessed at the trailheads at the Chesterfield Valley Athletic Complex or behind the Hardee's IcePlex. This section is 8 miles in length. The south trail, which is two miles long, can be accessed at Edison & Long Roads. Eventually the trail will be a 17 mile connected loop encompassing the Chesterfield Valley and connect with other regional trails.

The Riparian Trail

This trail is a half mile long and is part of a three-phase plan to construct a pedestrian/bike path which begins near the Chesterfield Family Aquatic Center and will extend to Old Chesterfield Road and eventually connect to the Monarch-Chesterfield Levee Trail. Parking for the trail users is available at the parking lot for the Family Aquatic Center.

Chesterfield Valley Athletic Complex (N. Outer 40 Road)

This 176-acre complex consists of 15 baseball/softball game fields, 14 baseball/softball practice fields, nine soccer game fields, two football game fields, five football practice fields and two multi-use game fields. It is also home to Miracle Field, made of a special playing surface that accommodates players of all abilities and ages.

Miracle Field

The City of Chesterfield partnered with former St. Louis Cardinals superstar Albert Pujols and former St. Louis Cardinal Mike Matheny to construct an athletic field designed for use by chil-

of the original families to settle here in Chesterfield. This 18-acre passive park preserves the history, character and charm of the site, with a farm-like theme throughout. The large red barn, originally constructed by the Eberweins approximately 100 years ago, was preserved. In addition, the park is accented with horse rail type fencing and several rain gardens throughout the site.

Amenities for the park include a trail system, a community garden, an open field for play, restrooms, and features a two-acre Dog Park. The Dog Park has a separate area for small dogs, and an area for all dogs, along with a pavilion to provide shelter and an area

Chesterfield Elementary School Park (Wild Horse Creek Road)

This 3.4-acre park was developed and is maintained in a cooperative partnership agreement with the Rockwood School District. The park features a playground, a walking path, a multipurpose court, athletic fields and a parking lot.

River Bend Elementary School Park (River Valley Drive)

This 3-acre park was developed and is maintained in a cooperative partnership agreement with the Parkway School District. The park features a playground, hard-surface multipurpose courts, athletic fields, a walking path and a parking lot.

Green Trails Elementary School Park (Portico Drive)

This 5-acre park was developed and is maintained in a cooperative partnership agreement with the Parkway School District. The park features a playground, hard-surface multipurpose courts, athletic fields, a walking path and a parking lot.

Chesterfield Parks and Recreation Programs

The Chesterfield Parks and Recreation Division offers a wide variety of fun recreational programs for all ages. Programs range from aquatic classes, including swim lessons and water aerobics, to sports camps such as Major League Soccer Camp and Baseball Camp. Faust County Park

The beautifully landscaped 200-acre Faust County Park is located 1.3 miles north of Chesterfield Mall. Visitors are often surprised by the number of varied attractions.

History buffs can stroll through Thornhill, the nearly 200-year-old home of Frederick Bates, the second governor of Missouri. This home is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. You can also visit the Historic Village, which authentically represents local history, architecture

dren with special needs. Miracle Field was created with the belief that every child deserves a chance to play baseball. Instead of dirt and natural grass, Miracle Field has a rubberized surface, making it easier for youngsters with walkers or wheelchairs to go around the bases and play different positions. The dugouts are oversized to accommodate wheelchairs.

W.F. Dierberg Meditation Park (13701 Olive Blvd.)

Eberwein Park

(Baxter and Old Baxter Road)

and lifestyles of the 1800s. Visitors will enjoy the huge state-of-the-art playground and will be thrilled by the circa-1920 carousel that once delighted children at the Forest Park Highlands Amusement Park. Rides are available for a minimal charge. The carousel is closed on Mondays.

On the opposite end of the park, you will find a historic home that has been converted to the Community Music School of Webster University. This area also has an amphitheater that is used for theatrical events and the Chesterfield Chamber of Commerce Summer Concert Series.

Faust Park is also home to the Sophia M. Sachs Butterfly House, a division of the Missouri Botanical Garden. Once you're inside the beautiful 8,000-square-foot Tropical Conservatory at the Butterfly House, nothing – not even a net – is between you and more than 1,000 butterflies. It's impossible not to be thrilled when brightly colored butterflies glide past or when you witness a butterfly emerging from its chrysalis right before your eyes. Although the butterflies are a can't-miss, there is more to see and do at this earth-friendly attraction than you can imagine.

Riparian Trail

The Riparian Trail is a half mile long and is part of a three-phase plan to construct a pedestrian/bike path which begins near the Chesterfield Family Aquatic Center and will extend to Old Chesterfield Road and eventually connect to the Monarch-Chesterfield Levee Trail.

The “Arachnids” and “Small Wonders” exhibits give close-up views of some of the smaller creatures on this planet. A brief film in the Emerson Family Theater presents an inspiring view of butterfly life. Not to be missed is the upscale Madame Butterfly Gift Shop, which is brimming with books, unique gifts and educational toys inspired by butterflies.

The outdoor Butterfly Garden is a “backyard” demonstration garden. Plants were carefully selected to provide habitat for the animals in Faust Park and to serve as host plants for caterpillars and nectar sources for butterflies. The Monsanto Teaching Pavilion sits in the Butterfly Garden and provides a favorite location for many weddings.

Overlooking the Butterfly Garden on one side, and the reflecting pond on the other, the Emerson Lakeside Terrace is a multi-use patio that hosts weddings, receptions, corporate events, and black-tie galas.

The Butterfly House is open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday. From Memorial Day through

Labor Day, it is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. seven days a week. Admission is free to members of the Missouri Botanical Garden. For more information, call 636-530-0076 or visit butterflyhouse.org.

NEARBY PARKS

Dr. Edmund A. Babler Memorial State Park

One of the state's oldest and largest parks, Dr. Edmund A. Babler Memorial State Park, is located just southwest of Chesterfield off Highway 109 on Highway BA. Babler Park features 2,400 acres of densely wooded hills, valleys and ravines. In addition to its many private picnic areas, the park features baseball diamonds, equestrian trails, trails for hiking and cross-country skiing, a nature center, and tennis courts. The park also houses an educational center for the disabled and 80 family campsites. The visitors center is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. every day. Find information and make reservations at mostateparks.com.

Queeney Park

This is a gorgeous 570-acre wooded park just a short drive from Chesterfield off of Weidman Road. The park features West County's largest playground, numerous picnic areas, nature trails, horseback riding and an indoor complex complete with a roller hockey skating rink.

Greensfelder Park

Just 15 minutes away, Greensfelder Park has 1,700 acres of pristine forest and offers horseback riding, picnic facilities and camping.

Creve Coeur Park

Located just northeast of Chesterfield, Creve Coeur Park offers 300 acres of prime parkland. The park features playground areas, numerous sports fields, nature trails, pavilions, a lakeside park and a paved lakeside walking trail. Many wind surfers, competitive rowing teams and sailboat enthusiasts can be found skimming across Creve Coeur Lake on warm weekends.

August A. Busch Memorial Conservation Area and Rockwoods Reservation

Two state-maintained conservation areas, August A. Busch Memorial Conservation Area and Rockwoods Reservation, provide thousands of acres for sporting activities and wildlife observation. Access to the 200-mile-long Katy Trail is available from Busch, which is located just minutes from the heart of Chesterfield across the Missouri River on Highway 94. Rockwoods Reservation is located just south of Chesterfield and is easily accessible via Highway 109 just south of Highway 100.


Chesterfield Arts



STAGES St. Louis

Founded in 1987, and now based in Chesterfield, STAGES St. Louis is a professional, not-for-profit theater company dedicated to producing the indigenous American art form of musical theater and enriching the cultural milieu of the entire St. Louis community.

STAGES St. Louis presents over 100 performances each year in the 380-seat Robert G. Reim Theater in Kirkwood. The casts are selected from auditions in St. Louis and New York. STAGES is in the midst of an ambitious capital campaign to create a new home for its artistic and education programs, the STAGES St. Louis Performing Arts Center, in Chesterfield. When completed, the complex will include a 730-seat main stage and a 200-seat second theater.

As an educational venue, the STAGES Performing Arts Academy offers a year-round comprehensive musical theater curriculum of dance, voice, drama and theory. Classes are held at 444 Chesterfield Center, across from Chesterfield Mall. Faust County Park

You can step back in time almost 200 years when you tour Thornhill House, the home of Missouri's second governor. His home, Thornhill House, is the oldest standing governor's house in the state. The site includes his 1820s home, barn, reconstructed summer kitchen, ice and smoke house, orchard and herb garden, and family cemetery.

Architecture of the 1800s is continued in the historic Faust Village, which includes four homes and nine out-buildings built from 1840 to 1888. These homes represent a variety of building and architectural styles, from log to brick. All of these attractions are home to tours and festivals throughout the year.

Renovated by the Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra, the former Faust family mansion is now home to the

west county branch of the renowned Community Music School (CMS) of Webster University. Since 1925, CMS has provided outstanding music education and performance opportunities to students of all ages and abilities. The faculty's combination of musical and teaching expertise means students receive an exceptional quality of music education at every level.

Headquartered on the Webster University campus, CMS has an additional location in University City.

The St. Louis Carousel was built in 1921. It was first installed at the Forest Park Highlands, which burned to the ground in 1963, with the carousel being the only thing still standing. Thanks to the St. Louis County Historic Buildings Commission and Faust Cultural Heritage Foundation, the carousel was restored to its original beauty and installed in Faust Park in 1987. These 65 beautifully hand-carved deer, horses and chariots now provide rides and delight children and adults alike. The building is also used

for weddings, children's shows and many other activities.

What could be more enjoyable than spreading out a blanket under the stars and listening to music performed by some of the finest musicians in St. Louis? The free Summer Concerts in the Park have provided this pleasure to area residents for more than 20 years. Sponsored by the Chesterfield Chamber of Commerce, the concerts are held weekly at Faust County Park throughout the summer and attract thousands of residents and visitors who gather for the great music and food.

Sophia M. Sachs Butterfly House

A crown jewel located in Faust County Park is the Sophia M. Sachs Butterfly House, a division of the Missouri Botanical Garden. Considered to be among the very best butterfly houses in the world, this impressive attraction includes an 8,000 square-foot glass Tropical Conservatory, an exhibit hall, the Lopata Learning Lab, the Emerson Theater, the Madame Butterfly Gift Shop, the outdoor Butterfly Garden, Emerson Lakeside Terrace and Monsanto Teaching Pavilion.

Inside the Conservatory, visitors are surrounded by more than a thousand tropical butterflies, representing more than 60 species from around the world. It is impossible not to be thrilled as these brightly colored animals glide past in silent flight, or when you witness a butterfly emerging from its chrysalis right before your eyes. In addition to self-guided tours, regular events at the Butterfly House include educational programs for all ages, lectures, and camps for children.

In the Grand Hall, visitors can get an up-close look at insects and other arthropods from around the world. The upscale Madame Butterfly Gift Shop is brimming with unique gifts, educational toys, and books that are all inspired by butterflies.

Outside, the Butterfly Garden features host plants where butterflies lay their eggs and plants provide nectar for the adults. At the heart of the Butterfly Garden is the Monsanto Teaching Pavilion and the Emerson Lakeside Terrace, which overlooks the Butterfly

of Missouri, St. Louis; and Webster University all provide a rich cultural and educational tapestry for Chesterfield and the metropolitan area.

The Loretto-Hilton Center, on the campus of Webster University, is home to two professional performing arts companies, The Repertory Theater and Opera Theatre of Saint Louis, as well as Webster University's Conservatory of Theatre Arts. The center comprises two separate stages: The Virginia Jackson Browning Theatre is a 763-seat auditorium where no seat in the auditorium is more than 20 rows from the stage and The Emerson Studio Theatre, which is a flexible "black box" theatre space, seating approximately 125.

Located in mid-town St. Louis, just 25 minutes from Chesterfield, is Grand Center, which includes 12 museums and galleries and 13 performance venues that provide 12,000 theater seats within four blocks. Performance venues include: the Fabulous Fox, Powell Hall, Chaifetz Arena, Grandel Theatre, Jazz at the Bistro, the Kranzberg Art Center and the Sheldon. The size of the venues ranges from the Chaifetz, which seats over 10,000 people, to an intimate black box experience with 100 people in one of the Kranzberg theatres.

North of Chesterfield, The Verizon Wireless Amphitheater, hosts concerts year round including rock, pop, country, jazz and rhythm and blues, as well as special events; while the Blanche M. Touhill Performing Arts Center (at the University of Missouri) hosts headline performances by national and international artists.

The 79-acre Missouri Botanical Garden is widely considered one of the top three botanical gardens in the world. Top attractions include the Climatron tropical rain forest, a serene Japanese Garden and a home gardening area. In addition to breath-taking grounds the Garden hosts lectures, classes, concerts and special events.

Laumeier Sculpture Park showcases more than 80 works of contemporary sculpture within a 105-acre natural landscape. The indoor gallery features changing exhibitions and the park hosts cultural events throughout the year.

Other Cultural Institutions Close to Chesterfield

Forest Park is just a 20-minute drive east of Chesterfield. This cultural haven includes the St. Louis Art Museum, the Missouri History Museum, the St. Louis Zoo, the Muny and the St. Louis Science Center, an interactive learning center featuring dinosaurs, a planetarium, and an Omnimax Theater. The Muny is the nation's oldest and largest outdoor musical theater and produces hit Broadway musicals throughout the summer.

The Peabody Opera House, another downtown architectural gem, received a new lease in life in 2011 after being closed for 20 years. The multi-million dollar renovation opened the facility to rave reviews. The terrazzo floors, gleaming marble staircases and coffered ceilings are once again home to patrons of plays, music performances and civic events.







The City of Chesterfield strives to build on past successes in order to improve the quality of life for its residents and to create a "business-friendly" atmosphere where a wide variety of new business can flourish. It's accomplishing this goal by:

CITY OF CHESTERFIELD

Located in western St. Louis County and incorporated since 1988, the City of Chesterfield is still considered young but has accomplished much since its inception. Now with over 47,000 residents, it has grown to be one of the premier communities in the country. The Mayor and City Council are dedicated to making the community a place where resident's needs are met in that they

can live, work and play and do business in an enriched and safe environment. The City also strives to create partnerships within the community to promote businesses and civic organizations, such as the Chesterfield Chamber of Commerce, Chesterfield Arts, Junior Chamber International, and Progress 64 West, to name a few. Staff members are assisted by residents who volunteer for numerous committees and commissions and, who are instrumental to the City's success.

A highly sought after community to live in, Chesterfield has a highly-educated population with 65% having a college degree, and nearly 25% obtaining a master or doctorate degree. Residents earn a median income of \$114,939 annually. Access to two top-rated public school districts, Rockwood and Parkway, and numerous private schools make the City a location of choice for families.

Based on its population at the time of incorporation according to Missouri State Statutes, Chesterfield is classified as a Missouri City of the third class, allowing it to establish a Mayor/City Administrator/City Council form of government. The Mayor and eight non-partisan City Council members govern the City. The City is divided into four wards, or areas, having generally the same population, and two Council members represent each ward. The day-to-day operations of the City are handled by a City Administrator who ultimately manages over 200 full-time employees in the following departments:

- Community Services & Economic Development
- Finance & Administration
- Parks & Recreation
- Planning & Development Services/Public Works
- Police

Parks & Recreation

The City currently has nearly 320 acres of City-owned parkland, offering something for everyone. These include the Family Aquatic Center, a Dog Park, playing fields for every sport, trails, picnic areas and many playground and passive areas as well. Pool passes must be purchased at City Hall in person. Other business such as pavilion or amphitheater rentals can be done by phone.

Police

Chesterfield is one of the safest communities in the U.S. for communities its size. With nearly 90 commissioned officers, the Chesterfield Police Department has the distinction of being one of the premier law enforcement agencies in the state of Missouri. In 2003, the Department received international accreditation through the Commission for Accreditation of Law Enforcement Agencies, (CALEA). Aside from patrolling and protecting the City, the Department also offers a variety of community-based services such as Neighborhood and Business Watch programs and the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) program, among others. They offer many programs for child safety including finger printing and car seat checks, in addition to back to school programs. Additionally, the Department offers many crime-prevention and safety tips for neighborhoods.



ST. LOUIS COUNTY GOVERNMENT

The City of Chesterfield is located in St. Louis County, which covers an area of 524 square miles. With a 2011 population of 998,954, St. Louis County is the largest county in Missouri. It was created on October 1, 1812 by Governor William Clark as one of the first five counties in the Missouri Territory, nine years before Missouri attained statehood. In 1876 the city of St. Louis separated from St. Louis County, becoming an independent city that provides its own services.

The County is a Constitutional Charter County, and its government is provided for in its Charter. The County Executive is the chief executive officer of the County and is elected, in partisan elections, to four-year terms. The County Council is the legislative body of the County. Its seven members are elected to four-year staggered terms, by district, in partisan elections. The presiding officer of the County Council is the

Daycare and Preschool

When considering preschool, day care and nursery school facilities, Chesterfield families have a multitude of options from which to choose. Cambridge School is a full-day educational child care program for working parents with children ages six weeks through six years of age and serves the Chesterfield Valley and I-64 commuters. The school provides each child with a safe, clean and nurturing environment in which they can grow and learn at their own pace. Cambridge is run by veteran teachers and administrators.

West County Day School, Green Trails Pre-School, Town & Country PreSchool are also located within the Chesterfield area. All these facilities offer working Chesterfield families well supervised, nurturing environments.

At the West County YMCA, children ages 2 to pre-kindergarten can enjoy full day childcare at the facility's state-licensed and accredited Early Childhood


