- A. [BILL NO. 2822](#) AMENDS ORDINANCE NUMBER 35, SCHEDULE VI, INTERSECTION STOPS, OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CHESTERFIELD BY ADDING PROVISIONS THERETO TO INCLUDE RHL DRIVE AT COMMONS FRONTAGE ROAD (**FIRST READING; PLANNING/PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS APPROVAL**)

- A. [BILL NO. 2818](#) REPEALS ST.
