II. Approval of February 22, 2018 Minutes.

They were unanimously approved upon certain corrections.

III. Citizens Committee for the Environment Updates:

There was talk about increasing the numbers to 17. With our committee changes, we can get more done, with more members. Name changed to Chesterfield Citizens Environmental Advisory Committee. Can still keep name of CCE.

We fall under Parks, Recreation and Arts. Chair can serve for 4 consecutive years, then needs someone else to chair. After 2 years that same person can come back to chair. This gives others a chance to chair. We will have the power of Parks, Recreation and Arts Committee to help us do more and make an even bigger impact on our community. We can do more programs and events without going thru the Council and other channels. The committee expressed their opinion that we didn't particularly like the way these changes were handled, without letting us know, and without asking us for any of our own opinions and input. Our budget will still be under the general fund. Tom suggested we attend the Parks, Recreation and Art Committee Council, to be further involved.

B. ST. Louis County Pilot Project Grant – Tom, Su

There will be No rap. Only 1½ minute presentation about blue bin, and someone explain what we're doing with the different bins. This will be done at the amphitheater before each event. It will be Food Trucks, not our regular concessions. We will get posters; we will talk to the vendors to see what they are selling and what containers their using; we can encourage them to use recyclable containers. Styrofoam may be cheaper, but we will suggest they use paper and recyclable products. There are 26 new blue recycle bins. The signs that we made are very explanatory for what and where to recycle, even if someone can't read.

C. National Wildlife Federation – Tom

Tom filled out another survey so we should be getting some additional seeds. We will decide where and how they will be used for giveaways, or perhaps "grow" some for giveaways at i.e.: Arbor Day, November Recycles Day, etc.

D. Bears, Blankets discussion- Tom

- Charity Sharity corrected the beads and buttons on the Bears, and made the bags larger for the grocery bags. Bears and bags were just delivered today so there was no count. We need to ask for the amount we want to be stuffed, so we have the right size for filling the bags. Tom will check with them. We talked about having only one person to be our contact at Charity Sharity. We may ask the Charity Sharity person making the deliveries, or their contact “person” to come to our retreat.

5 Posters will go at Mall and 1 large one at Vintage Market Days

- Conservation Awards at noon:
They are listed. The honorees will get The Bee Boxes and a certificate.
- Habitat For Humanity
They are not able to come to Earth Day. They are moving and reorganizing their warehouse. Tom offered to collect the items and deliver to Habitat. This will keep people who bring their wares to dispose of happy and keep items out of the landfill. (Suggestions: use freecycle website, and Chesterfield can promote in brochure to tell people to save their stuff during their remodeling projects, for Habitat.
- Monsanto Bee boxes
Having a table top. Bee guy is giving a presentation. Will have a live hive with him. They gave us 50 boxes.

We need to print out planting instructions. JT has two big packets. North Central Wildflower Mix is new this year. Local seeds. JT will give Tom some dates and get the info out via email. Looking at 2nd week in April. Possibly the 11th.

It's listed. Some were already booked. No stage. We'll be more in center, near carousel. Spread out vendors more and open it up.
