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## RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

The Pledge of Allegiance and Flag Ceremony was presented by two members of Boy Scout Troop 848 from Highcroft School; Bill Miltenberger and T. J. Smyka. Also in attendance was Scout Leader Thomas Smyka.

Bishop Duane Boyce of the Church of Latter Day Saints #9 led the City Council in prayer.

**APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES**

The Minutes of the January 16, 1989, meeting were submitted for approval. A motion was made by Councilmember Bute, seconded by Councilmember Hrabko, to approve the Minutes. A roll call vote was taken for approval of the Minutes with the following results: Ayes - Fawcett, Hrabko, Hartman, Bute, Neiner, Flachsbart. Nays - None. Absent - Overall, Frank. The Minutes were approved.

**INTRODUCTORY REMARKS - MAYOR FRED STEINBACH**

Mayor Fred Steinbach stated that February 7, 1989 was an election date and hoped everyone would exercise their privilege to vote.

Mayor Fred Steinbach next read a statement issued by the City Council concerning the issue of sales tax distribution in St. Louis County. The City's position is that they will take positive action to accomplish a change in the current law which would allow Chesterfield to leave the sales tax pool and become a point of sale "A" City. (See attached)

Mayor Steinbach next stated that the first Annual report of the City of Chesterfield had been prepared. This report was completed under the direction of the City Administrator Michael Herring, Department Heads, and Administrative staff. This document contains a concise summary of the various activities and accomplishments of the City of Chesterfield during its first seven months since incorporation, June 1, 1988, and in addition, each department has identified major areas of activity scheduled for calendar year 1989. Copies of this report will be available at the Chesterfield Government Center for any resident of the City of Chesterfield.

Mayor Steinbach stated the next meeting of the City Council will be held Wednesday, February 22, 1989, rather than Monday, February 20, 1989, at City Hall. The time will be 7:30 P.M.

Mayor Steinbach next stated that City Administrator Michael Herring has been named to Who's Who in City Management and that the "City Administrator" position has been officially recognized by the International City Management Association.

Mayor Steinbach then read a Proclamation, issued by the City of Chesterfield, regarding Mr. Jack Wells, head football coach of Parkway West, who is retiring after thirty-eight (38) years. (See attached)

Mayor Fred Steinbach next stated that on February 1, 1989, a meeting was held with representatives of the St. Louis County Highway Department, Bommarito Construction, and various officials of the City of Chesterfield concerning the status of the Chesterfield Village Parkway Bridge closing. Mayor Steinbach asked Councilmember Hrabko, who helped organize this meeting to summarize what took place. Councilmember Hrabko reported that the following information was obtained: (1) The bridge over Highway 40 on the Chesterfield Village Parkway must be closed from mid-March until mid-June; this being contingent upon the contractor experiencing no weather or labor related problems; (2) The project will involve construction of a new exit ramp for Eastbound traffic on Highway 40 to Chesterfield Airport Road and Chesterfield Village Parkway; (3) During construction adequate detours will be provided to allow Eastbound traffic on Chesterfield Airport Road to access Southbound Chesterfield Village Parkway and Northbound traffic on Chesterfield Village Parkway to access Westbound Chesterfield Airport Road; (4) Once completed, the State of Missouri will construct two (2) new ramps onto Highway 40. The representatives from St. Louis County Highway Department and Bommarito Construction agreed to take whatever steps were within their control to insure a speedy completion of this project and to provide updated information to the City of Chesterfield concerning progress on this project.

## **COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### **Public Works Committee**

Councilmember Fawcett, Chairperson of the Public Works Committee, stated that the Public Works Committee had recommended approval by the City Council of a policy for the acceptance of private streets throughout the City of Chesterfield. A motion was made by Councilmember Fawcett, seconded by Councilmember Hrabko, that the City accept private streets for

maintenance that meet the criteria established by this Committee. These conditions would be reevaluated after December 31, 1990. A voice vote was taken for passage and approval, and the motion was approved unanimously.

Councilmember Fawcett next stated that the Public Works Committee recommends approval by the City Council of an agreement to maintain grass medians of the southeastern portion of the Chesterfield Village Parkway, that will be constructed by the St. Louis County Department of Highways and Traffic. A motion was made by Councilmember Fawcett, seconded by Councilmember Flachsbart, to accept responsibility for maintaining grass medians of the Chesterfield Village parkway, to be located in the southeast quadrant from Clarkson Road to Highway 40. A voice vote was taken for passage and approval, and the motion was approved unanimously.

### **Planning / Economic Development**

Councilmember Hrabko, Chairperson of the Planning/Economic Development Committee, first summarized previous policies developed for acceptance of streets within subdivisions. Mr. Hrabko stated that a policy needed to be established for streets in Commercial developments. A motion was made by Councilmember Hrabko, seconded by Councilmember Flachsbart, that the Director of Public Works made recommendations on a case by case basis relative to acceptance of streets within commercial developments, and that subsequent developers utilizing said roads will be required to post a bond or escrow to insure required maintenance for the duration of construction. A voice vote was taken for passage and approval, and the motion was approved unanimously.

Councilmember Hrabko, next stated that Bill #240, a request for rezoning from non-urban to "R-1" which is scheduled for adoption later in the agenda was sent to the Council with no recommendation from the Planning/Economic Development Committee, due to mixed feelings by members of the Committee concerning this proposal.

Councilmember Hrabko next stated that Bill #241, a request for rezoning of property located on the north side of Highway 40; Bill #242, a request for an amended PEU in the R-5 residence district located on the West side of Straub Road; Bill #243, a request for rezoning by the Stonebriar Development Corporation; Bill #244, regarding the Miceli Development at Kehrs Mill and Clarkson and the Stonebriar Development Corp.; Bill #245, dealing with the construction of a two-level parking structure on the south side of South Outer Forty east of Yarmouth drive; Bill #246, dealing with the construction of a retaining wall at the southwest corner of Olive Blvd. and Schoettler Road; Bill #247, relative to the Borman Development construction traffic access; and Bill #248, a petition for vacation of Old Wild Horse Creek Road, are scheduled for consideration later in the agenda.

Councilmember Hrabko next reported that the Planning and Economic Development Committee was developing a proposed ordinance for the City of Chesterfield for regulation of operation of taxi cabs within the City of Chesterfield. It will be on the agenda for the February 22, 1989, Council meeting.

Councilmember Hrabio then stated that Bill #249, dealing with the Planning and Zoning Commission being in compliance with the state statute regarding terms of office, is scheduled for consideration later in the agenda.

Councilmember Hrabko next read the list of the twenty-six (26) volunteers that the City Council had selected to serve on the Citizens Advisory Group of the Comprehensive Plan Commission. (See attached)

Councilmember Bute, President Pro-Tem of City Council, read the list of volunteers selected from the nine existing boards and commissions of the City of Chesterfield that will serve on the Citizens Advisory Group of the Comprehensive Plan Commission. (See attached)

### **Finance & Administration**

Councilmember Neiner, Chairperson of the Finance and Administration Committee, reported that the Finance and Administration Committee had met on January 26, 1989, and the agenda had addressed clarification of internal procedural matters.

Councilmember Neiner next stated that the Chesterfield Chamber Commerce and the City of Chesterfield had established a working relationship that will be of mutual benefit to the citizens and the business community. Councilmember Neiner next thanked Mayor Steinbach, City Administrator Herring, Chief of Police, Ray Johnson and Jerry Duepner, Director of Planning/Economic Development, for attending a retreat held by the Chesterfield Chamber of Commerce, and for making very meaningful and pertinent contributions.

Mayor Steinbach congratulated Councilmember Neiner on behalf of himself and the City Council for becoming the new President of the Chesterfield Chamber of Commerce.

### **Public Health & Safety**

Councilmember Flachsbart, Chairperson of the Public Health and Safety Committee, stated that the Public Health and Safety Committee recommended a resolution which would permit a lease agreement on a facility for the Chesterfield Police Department.

Following a reading by Councilmember Flachsbart, a motion was made by Councilmember Bute, seconded by Councilmember Fawcett, to adopt Resolution #48.

A voice vote was taken for passage and approval of Resolution #48, and the resolution was approved unanimously. (See attached)

Councilmember Flachsbart next stated that Bill #239, which relates to allowing the City of Chesterfield's Municipal Judge to assign alternative community service rather than a fine, is

scheduled for consideration later in the agenda.

### **REPORT FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR**

City Administrator Herring stated that the City of Chesterfield had received bids for the purpose of police badges. Seven (7) proposals were received. City Administrator Herring recommended, along with Chief of Police , Ray Johnson and Jan Kluba, Finance Director, approval by the City Council of the second low bid, as the low bidder failed to comply with bid specifications. A motion was made by Councilmember Flachsbart, seconded by Councilmember Bute, to approve the purchase of police badges through Great Lakes Police, Fire and Safety Equipment at the total cost of \$5,207.95. A voice vote was taken for passage and approval, and the motion was approved unanimously.

City Administrator next stated that the City of Chesterfield has received a liquor license request from Hi-Ho-Helium, Inc., to include liquor in its original package to be included as gifts in their balloon bouquets. The application has been reviewed by Director of Planning/Economic Development, Jerry Duepner, in terms of compliance with zoning, and he recommends approval. Chief of police, Ray Johnson, has completed a background check, and he recommends approval as well. A motion was made by Councilmember Flachsbart, seconded by Councilmember Bute, to approve a liquor license for Hi-Ho-Helium, Inc., located at 1749 Clarkson Road, to sell all kinds of intoxicating liquor in the original package not to be consumed on premises. A voice vote was taken for passage and approval, and the liquor license request was approved unanimously.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Councilmember Hartman reported that the residents of the seventeen (17) subdivisions adjoining Schoettler Road, had formed an association, known as Schoettler Road Residents Association. Councilmember Hartman, along with Councilmember Bute, Mayor Steinbach, and Dr. William Whitehall, Chairperson of St. Louis County Council, attended a meeting with this Association, with regard to St. Louis County's Proposition A, which was going to include the widening of Schoettler Road from two lanes to five lanes. The Schoettler Road Residents Association, requested that the City of Chesterfield work along with them and the County in order to honor the requests of the people along that road. Whereupon Councilmember Hartman introduced the following resolution.

### **COMMUNICATIONS & PETITIONS**

Mr. Bill Levin, who resides at 14232 Cypress Hill Drive, expressed concern over the specifications on the request for proposal for the Computer Automation System to be utilized at Chesterfield Government Center.

Mayor Steinbach thanked Mr. Levin for his interest in the City of Chesterfield and stated that the matter would be brought to the attention of the Finance and Administration Committee.
