

Chesterfield Historical Commission
Minutes
September 13, 2006

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Chris Landram at 730 p.m. There were 16 members in attendance.

Minutes

Chris asked everyone to take copies of the August minutes home to read. They will be passed at the October 11 meeting.

Treasurer

Bob Landram reported a balance on hand of \$15,107.05. Arland Stemme announced that the calendars were ready to go to press.

Old Business.

1. Historical Marker

Dan Rothwell reported on the September Dedication of the Justus Post Marker at Wildhorse School. He told the Commission that the marker was in place. He went over the agenda and final plans for the ceremony and passed out a schedule of the events and the speakers.

2. Bus Tour

The Bus Tour is scheduled for 930 a.m. on October 7. Arland Stemme volunteered to help Dan sell books and calendars.

3 Artifacts

Henry Pecherski reported on the growing problems of Indian habitation site destruction. He said the site at Wilson Road and Wild Horse Creek Road needed to be examined, but the bulldozers are ready to start. The Artifacts Committee is ready to provide the city with color-coded maps of destroyed, current, and likely sites to promote safeguarding the native heritage of Chesterfield.

4. Minna Waldman House

Jane Durrell reported that the Missouri Conservation Commission had taken down the broken tree limb in front of the house. But there was no movement on the agreement between the state and Chesterfield.

5. Arrangements for the September 23 dedication.

Jane suggested that someone on the commission bring a camera to the ceremony. Dan said the school was reluctant to donate chairs for the occasion. Bob Defer offered to bring 8. The Wunderlichs will bring the commission sound system.

6. Cemetery

Bill Wunderlich reminded Jane Durrell to ask the city to remove the cemetery gate.

New Business

1. Fall Festival

The Commission will sell calendars and books at the Fall Festival. Sept. 30 and Oct.1. Jesse Francis offered a 30'x30' tent to hold the displays and sales. Ted Goedeke passed a sign-up sheet for volunteers to man the tent.

2. Artifacts

The Artifacts Committee is creating an extensive multi-media program for 4th grade Chesterfield students to educate them on the Native American heritage of the area. They need funds to construct a hands-on display of arrowheads. Terry Wunderlich moved, and Bill Wunderlich seconded, a motion to donate \$200 for construction materials. The motion passed. Since the Landmarks Committee already has artifacts, Jesse Francis offered a display case to show some pieces at the Fall Festival.

3. Photo Album

Marcella Mertz said she had met Dan Chances' daughter and had obtained the Album Dan had compiled on the Dedication of the City of Chesterfield. The album was passed around the commission. Marcella asked for volunteers to identify and label the pictures.


Announcements
