Chesterfield City Council Awards 2007 Citizen Of The Year To Maurice "Bud" Hirsch

The Chesterfield City Council named Maurice "Bud" Hirsch as its 2007 Citizen of the Year. A Citizens Selection Committee presented their recommendation to the Council following their review of several nominations. Mayor John Nations presented Mr. Hirsch with the award at the March 19 City Council meeting.

Citizens are recognized for their benefit to the City of Chesterfield through volunteerism, working on community projects, and overall civic contributions to the community. Mr. Hirsch has served on the Planning Commission since 2003, serving as the Vice-Chairman from 2004-2006 and has been serving as the Chairman since 2006. He is a member of the City's Citizens Advisory Committee for the Spirit of St. Louis Airport Noise and Land Use Compatibility Study, was a member of the City's Architectural Review Board from 2000-2003, and was a member of the City's Parks, Recreation and Arts Advisory Committee from 1988-2000. Mayor Nations stated

that Mr. Hirsch served on this Committee during a very instrumental time in the City's history as they worked to establish and grow the City's park system.

"Bud's input into the parks and recreation planning process has been invaluable," said Nations.

Mr. Hirsch also has been a Board Member of Chesterfield Arts since 1995 and has served as treasurer since that time. He is a Board Member of the Repertory Theater of St. Louis, he was elected as the Lifetime Director of the Central Agency for Jewish Education in 1974 and has served on the Board of Trustees for the Jewish Federation of St. Louis.

Chesterfield Parks & Recreation Offers a Wide Variety of Summer Family Activities

After a long, cold and snowy winter, it's time to get out and enjoy all Chesterfield has to offer you and your family with our parks and recreation activities. Our family has particularly enjoyed utilizing the new **Levee Trail** in the Valley, which runs from the Hardee's Iceplex to the Chesterfield Valley Athletic Complex. The kids can ride their bikes while the parents walk and relax a little! I was pleased to participate in a ribbon cutting ceremony for the trail earlier this year celebrating the partnership with Great Rivers Greenway that made the trail possible. There's great scenery along the trail and haven't you always wondered what is on the other side of the levee?

In 2004, voters approved Proposition P which established a one-half cent sales tax in which all of the proceeds are dedicated exclusively to parks and recreation. These funds have provided for improvements at the Chesterfield Family Aquatic Center made in 2007, the Levee Trail and improvements to the Chesterfield Valley Athletic Complex that we can all benefit from for years to come.

I'm always proud to see the number of parents who volunteer an inestimable number of hours to coach our youth sports teams at the **Chesterfield Valley Athletic Complex (CVAC)**. Updates at the CVAC this year include the trailhead location for the **Levee Trail** and the addition of covered bleachers offering much needed shade on those blazing hot days. You'll notice a great deal of land work and construction happening at the east end of the complex. Under construction is a Parks Administration and Maintenance facility so all of our parks employees and equipment can be housed under one roof. Long range plans call for additional sports fields in this area as well. This highly sought-after venue is host to national tournaments throughout the year, as well as regional and local tournaments.

Over 900 pool passes have already been sold for the 2008 swim season at the **Chesterfield Family Aquatic Center**. Swim teams are filling up quickly and soon we'll be hearing the squealing and laughter of children as they enjoy the fun amenities of the play area created especially for them. In addition to the leisure and competition pools, and water slides, we also have the Lazy River. Bring the whole family and enjoy the summer days poolside. Also, if your dog is like mine and always ready for some fun, come to the popular K-9



Splash at the end of the season on Tuesday, September 2.

Having a reunion or just a family outing this summer? Consider the pavilion at **Central Park** to help create those special memories. Pack a picnic lunch and enjoy beautiful scenery and play area for the children, or enjoy a stroll in the area or on the Parkway in the evening.

I have received many questions about the lakes that are visible from the Chesterfield Parkway which were dug last year. Many have asked at subdivision meetings **how the lakes could still be empty** after all the rain we have endured in recent months? The reason is that after the lakes have been prepared for the water, the dirt must sit and settle before water may be allowed to fill, or the water might destabilize the new banks of the lakes. We anticipate that the lakes will be allowed to begin filling late this summer, but a final determination will ultimately be made based on the condition of the basin. Natural rainwater runoff from the mall and surrounding areas will then begin to fill the lakes naturally. In the not too distant future, you will be able to fish, enjoy a paddleboat or canoe ride and walk around the lake on a trail system connected to the Levee Trail in the Chesterfield Valley.

Please plan to attend the **4th of July fireworks spectacular** and entertainment at Chesterfield Mall. In only our third year of this event, it has already become what is widely considered the best in the region. The entertainment will begin at 7:00 p.m. when the Smash Band takes the stage, and will conclude with the fireworks show beginning at 9:30. Enjoy food from vendors or bring your own!

Returning for a second year are the **Movies on the Plaza** at City Hall which are free to everyone and shown at sunset on the last Friday of the month through August. They are very family friendly movies, so bring your lawn chairs and snacks and settle in to watch the big screen outside.

City Of Chesterfield Fireworks Ordinance

As the 4th of July approaches many people will enjoy the holiday with back yard barbecues, swimming, family fun and other summer activities. However, it's important to know that a Chesterfield City ordinance has long prohibited individuals from either selling or discharging fireworks, except by permit. Fireworks can be dangerous at times and can cause both personal injury and property damage. The Chesterfield Ordinance pertaining to fireworks reads as follows:

(a) It is unlawful for any person to manufacture, sell, offer for sale, ship or cause to be shipped into the corporate limits of the City of Chesterfield, any item of fireworks. This section applies to nonresidents as well as residents of the City.

(b) Any person possessing or transporting special fireworks into the corporate limits of the City of Chesterfield for the purpose of conducting a special fireworks display shall be licensed by the state fire marshal as a distributor in accordance with Section 320.126 RSMo. 1985, as amended.

(c) Before any permit for a special fireworks display shall be issued by the City Administrator, the fair association, amusement park, organization, firm, or corporation making the application therefore shall furnish proof of financial responsibility to satisfy claims for damages to property or personal injuries arising out of any act or omission on the part of such person, firm or corporation or any agent or employee thereof.

Sec. 13-23. Explosion, ignition, discharge unlawful.

It is unlawful for any person to explode, ignite or discharge any articles of fireworks within the corporate limits of the City.

Tree Topping-What You Need to Know

Topping is defined by the Missouri Community Forestry Council as the drastic cutting back of large branches, leaving open wounds which subject the tree to disease and decay. Proper pruning cuts are made at branch unions, where the tree can easily seal the wound. A tree is unable to seal the wounds created by topping, and large areas of decay form high up in the tree. To compound the problem, topping forces a tree to quickly compensate for the loss all of its foliage by creating numerous "water sprouts." These weakly attached shoots grow so rapidly that they cannot support their own weight, and are much more prone to breakage than a healthy, normally attached branch.



Unscrupulous tree care companies often offer this service to unsuspecting homeowners after large storms, profiting off of peoples' fear. If you are concerned about storm damage, have an ISA Certified Arborist properly prune your tree. The arborist will carefully remove dead, diseased, or poorly attached branches, retaining the tree's natural shape. 
The City of Chesterfield can only truly be prepared if Chesterfield businesses, neighborhoods, schools and families are prepared.

The Chesterfield Police Department, an Internationally Accredited Agency, Seeks Your Assistance in Improving Services

The purpose of this survey is to assist the police department in assessing the organization's ability to provide high level services to the community, determine victim service needs, and receive overall feedback about contact with members of the police department.

A New Program Implemented To Enhance Child Safety Throughout The Region

The Chesterfield Police Department has implemented a program designed to call attention to children in car seats and to ensure that no child is accidentally left in a vehicle during inclement weather. The program was developed in response to several tragic incidents across the country wherein small children were left in car seats during the very hot days of summer.

The program is called "Child Check" and utilizes a bright yellow tag placed on a rear view mirror with the phrase "LOOK BEFORE YOU LEAVE." Every time a child is in their car seat the child check tag should be placed on the rear view mirror.

This will serve as a reminder to the parents, and also any passerby seeing the bright yellow tag hanging from the mirror to check in and make sure that there is not a child left unattended in the vehicle.

The Chesterfield Police Department, in conjunction with a grant provided by the MoDot Highway Safety Department, will be providing these tags with every car seat installation and at various public presentations on child safety throughout the area. Who's knocking at my door?

The arrival of nicer weather often means an increase in solicitors – individuals or groups going door-to-door to sell items or services or request donations.

While this activity is legal in Chesterfield, solicitors are required to obtain a license and might have to pay a fee for this license. Charitable organizations are exempt from paying a fee.

If someone knocks on your door with something to sell or a cause to promote, you have the right to ask to see their license, which is a one-page document typed on official City of Chesterfield letterhead, and has the City's raised seal affixed to the document. If they are unable to do so, you are encouraged to report the person(s) to the police department at 636-537-3000 and provide as many details as possible to help the police apprehend the right person(s).

"No Solicitors, No Peddlers" stickers are available free of charge at City Hall or you can call the Customer Service Center at 636-537-4000 and request that a sticker be mailed to you.
