Happy 2023 to all our residents! There are so many things going on that it is hard to know where to begin.

First of all, our City Council unanimously approved the recommendation of the Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Commission on December 14. This will pave the way for financing of infrastructure projects within a redeveloped Chesterfield Mall (which we envision to become a downtown Chesterfield) and the surrounding area in the coming years. These projects will be paid for by developers and property owners whose properties are improved, resulting in increased property and assessed. There are no subsidies or tax abatements, and no increase in sales or property taxes to our residents. Chesterfield will not be a guarantor of any financing associated with these projects, however, our City and its residents will benefit from the completion of these projects. Projects that will benefit the surrounding area are North Outer 40 connection to Chesterfield Parkway West and Swingley Ridge, upgrading the bridge on Baxter over Bonhomme Creek, improvements to the Central Park area, and Clarkson-Baxter interchange improvements.

Use Tax

At the January 17 City Council Meeting, an ordinance was approved to place the Use Tax on the April 4 ballot. The measure narrowly failed last year and it is thought that if the voters are better informed and educated, the chance of passage will be different. History and facts about a Use Tax are as follows: •Passage would extend existing 1% tax to purchases from out-of-state

•There is no increase in the existing rate of municipal tax •Original passage was for all purchases, not just those from within Missouri

•Loophole in law was created by Supreme Court in 1992 (Quill vs. North Dakota)

•Loophole was closed by Supreme Court in 2018 (South Dakota vs. Wayfair)

•In 2021, the Missouri Legislature passed the Use Tax for the State of Missouri, but required local governments to obtain voter approval

•Revenue from this source would come to the General Revenue for Police, Parks, Public Works, or any municipal service

•Estimates of shopping from out-of-state are in excess of 15% and climbing

•Revenues from a Use Tax would offset declining revenues due to increasing online shopping as well as increasing expenses due to growth and inflation

To register to vote in St. Louis County, you must be 18 years of age by Election Day, a U.S. Citizen, and a resident of St. Louis County.

The Missouri Voter Registration Application and information on absentee voting are available online at *https://stlouiscountymo.gov/st-louis-county-government/board-of-elections/* Citizens may also pick up the application at City Hall or most St. Louis County public libraries.

Additionally, registration forms can be mailed to you by calling City Hall at 636.537.4000. The deadline to register for this election is March 8.

Who's Knocking at my Door?

The arrival of nicer weather often means an increase in solicitors – individuals or groups going door-to-door to sell items or services or request donations.

While this activity is legal in Chesterfield, solicitors are required to obtain a permit and might have to pay a fee. Charitable and religious organizations, as well as political canvassers, are exempt from this requirement.



If someone knocks on your door with something to sell or a cause to promote, you have the right to ask to see their permit, which is a one-page document typed on official City of Chesterfield letterhead, and has the City's raised seal affixed to the document. If they are unable produce a permit, you are encouraged to report the person(s) to the police department at 636.537.3000.

"No Solicitors, No Peddlers" stickers are available free of charge at City Hall or you can call the Customer Service Center at 636.537.4000 and request that a sticker be mailed to you.



Proposition U is on the Ballot April 4

Chesterfield City Council has placed Proposition U on the April 4 ballot, allowing residents to cast their vote to close the tax loophole, which allows out-of-state vendors to avoid collecting local sales taxes, while mandating that Missouri retailers collect all local sales tax. Any purchase from a business with a presence in Missouri will be unaffected. A "yes" vote on Proposition U, will close the loophole and require that out-of-state vendors collect local sales tax, just like our local businesses are required to. The application of local sales taxes for outof-state purchases is referred to as the Use Tax. The Missouri Retailers Association, The Missouri Chamber of Commerce, and the Chesterfield Regional Chamber of Commerce all support passage of the Use Tax.

What is a Use Tax?

A Use Tax is the application of the existing local tax on goods purchased from out-of-state (most often online) for delivery to and use in the City of Chesterfield. If voters approve Proposition U on April 4, the 1% local Use Tax would be collected on goods and services purchased from out-of-state vendors.

Currently, the City of Chesterfield collects a 1% local tax on all goods and services purchased from local businesses. However, due to a tax loophole created by the courts, purchases made from out-of-state vendors are not required to collect the 1% local sales tax.

For example, if a person purchases furniture at a local Chesterfield store, the seller collects a 1% local sales tax on that item. However, if the same person purchases the same furniture from a vendor located outside the State of Missouri, the seller does not collect that same 1% local sales tax.

How will the Use Tax revenue be spent?

The revenue generated from the use tax would be allocated in the same manner as the City's local sales tax which funds Police, Parks, and Public Works. Chesterfield residents would benefit from the Use Tax. as Chesterfield's total tax revenues have decreased \$980,185 (-2.47%) since 2018, while inflation has impacted our expenses by 8.7% during that same period. The City's current fiveyear projection indicates that City expenditures will exceed revenues beginning in 2025, requiring deficit spending to simply maintain the current level of services. The City's financial information is available for you to view on the City's transparency portal https://www.chesterfield.mo.us/doccenter.html The costs to fund law enforcement, fuel and maintain police cars, perform street and sidewalk repairs, purchase de-icing salt, utility expenses to operate City facilities, and maintain and operate our parks continue to rise while total revenues are decreasing. The Use Tax will allow the City to maintain the high level of public safety and municipal services we currently enjoy. Equally as important, City retailers would not be disadvantaged by having to collect a sales tax which out-of-state vendors can avoid.

If approved by the voters in April, the Use Tax rate on out-of-state purchases would be the exact same as the local sales tax rate. Residents would never have to pay both. Local sales tax is collected on in-state sales, while the Use Tax is only collected on out-ofstate sales, but never both.

West County Citizen Police Academy

The West County Citizen Police Academy is an educational citizen-involved activity designed by the Chesterfield, Creve Coeur, Des Peres, Frontenac, Kirkwood, Ladue, Olivette, and Town & Country Police Departments. The goal is to promote understanding between the community's residents and its police officers regarding their respective needs and problems. By promoting this relationship, citizens and police can work together to make the community a safer place to live.

The Citizen Police Academy is a unique opportunity to educate the public about the criminal justice system and provide insight into everyday police work. The Academy is designed to give the public a chance to observe and understand law enforcement through a hands-on approach. Entrance into this program is by application only.

Several areas of police training will be covered during the nine-week Academy. Role-playing scenarios will be used to reinforce the learning process and give participants a chance to share some "real life" police situations. Finally, applicants will be afforded the opportunity to ride along with police officers to observe firsthand the daily challenges they face.

Some of the topics covered will include:

- Constitutional Law
- •Criminal Law
- •Use of Force
- •Criminal Investigations
- •Traffic Enforcement
- •DWI Investigations
- •Police Weaponry & Weapons Safety

Citizen Police Academy graduates will not become police officers; however, they will have a greater understanding of law enforcement and a community partnership will be established.

A background check of all applicants will be completed to ensure the safety and confidentiality of law-enforcement specific material. All applicants must be over 18.

The next class begins on Wednesday, March 1, 2023 and runs through May 3, 2023. All classes will be held on consecutive Wednesday nights.

Online Registration for the Chesterfield Police Department's 2023 Safety Town Program will begin at 8 a.m. on Wednesday, March 8 through the City's website *https://www.chesterfield.mo.us/safety-town. html*

Walk-in applications will also be accepted at the Chesterfield Police Department beginning at 8 a.m. on the same date. Preference will be given to applicants who have not previously attended Safety Town.

Safety Town is a nationally recognized preschool safety program which teaches four to six year-olds about a wide variety of safety issues, including 911/ police, fire safety, animal safety, bicycle safety, water safety, school bus safety, playground safety, and stranger danger. The program includes classroom activities, as well as outside hands-on activities in the miniature Safety Town city. The program is hosted and staffed by the Chesterfield Police Department. The program consists of six, two-week sessions running from June 5-July 21.

Safety Town is one of the Chesterfield Police Department's most popular programs. In addition to commissioned police officers, the Safety Town Staff includes teen counselors from area middle and high schools who volunteer to assist the police officers in leading the program. 
DEA National Drug Take Back

Each year the Chesterfield Police Department participates in the DEA National Prescription Drug Take Back Days in the spring and fall. These events aim to provide a safe, convenient and responsible means for the disposal of unwanted/unneeded prescription medications, while also turning the public spotlight on the potential for abuse of these medications.

This year's spring DEA National Prescription Drug Take Back Day will be held on Saturday, April 22 at both the Chesterfield Police Station (690 Chesterfield Parkway West) and Clarkson Valley's City Hall (15933 Clayton Road) from 10 a.m.-2 p.m.

For each event, we will only accept Prescription Medications (nothing over the counter). We will not accept liquids, inhalers/aerosols, needles of any kind, or dietary supplements. Leave medications in the original packaging as loose pills can present a hazard to those working the Drug Take Back. All medications collected will be incinerated, so there is no need to remove labels.

We look forward to this event and everyone doing their part as a community to help end the abuse of prescription medications.





Pill Collection Box

The City of Chesterfield has a medication drop off box where residents can deposit unused/unwanted prescription medications. It is in the main lobby of City Hall, and available during normal business hours, 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Please note that we only accept prescription medications still in the original bottle. Some of the guidelines are as follows:

•Pills only please--No liquids, ointments, inhalers, aerosols or syringes

•Pills must be in the original prescription bottle--No loose pills in a plastic bag

•Prescription medications only--No over-the-counter products, vitamins, supplements, lotions or first aid supplies

Labels may be left on the bottles as all containers/medications will be sent directly to an EPA approved incinerator.

The program is run through the Chesterfield Police Department. For any questions, call the non-emergency number at 636.537.3000.

Planning and Zoning Basics

Are you reading this publication because you are considering making that exciting move to become a first-time homeowner in the City of Chesterfield? Perhaps you are considering buying land as an investment project. Maybe you are seeking out that perfect rental location to start up that business you have always dreamed of opening.

Whatever the case may be, it is important to begin by becoming familiar with basic municipal zoning regulations. Each city's zoning ordinances are thoughtfully created in accordance with a Land-Use Plan which is a vision for the municipality, taking into consideration the geography, location, population and other factors that might be specific to the area. While there are some procedures set in place to make changes in use or to allow exceptions to many regulations, keep in mind that land-use plans are created with the goal of promoting order and harmony for the citizens within.

Whether it is a residential, commercial, industrial or a mixed-use district, there might be various allowable uses, building standards, lot size and setback requirements for each. It is important to remember that within the City of Chesterfield, apart from the zoning district, there might also be site-specific ordinances with any given parcel that possibly affect, use, setbacks, and other aspects of development. Some regulations are governed by state or federal ordinances.

Wherever you begin that search for a home, do your research. Will setback allowances restrict you from building that pool that you are dreaming about? Will the lot shape still allow you room for that accessory structure? Are there floodplain concerns that will govern if/how you build a garage? Another consideration, while this is not governed by the City, is the possibility of subdivision indentures that regulate certain things within the subdivision that you are considering.

If you are looking to start a business, confirm that the location that you are interested in running your business from has allowances for that particular use. This goes for uses on vacant land as well. Lot size requirements for particular uses must also be a consideration.

Temporary Dumpster Use On a Residential Lot

If you are planning on doing any type of renovation to your home, there's a good chance that you are considering placing a dumpster on your property for the duration of your project for the removal of construction debris. While the temporary placement of dumpsters in residential areas is allowed, one must first apply for a permit through the City of Chesterfield.

In May of 2020, the City passed Ordinance 3104, which requires Municipal Zoning Approval (MZA) for the placement of dumpsters on or adjacent to residential properties.

Here are a few things to keep in mind regarding MZA applications for dumpsters:



•This is a separate application process from any permitting that is related to the construction project itself.

•As part of the application, you will need to submit a plot plan, aerial image, or drawing that shows the proposed location of the dumpster.

•The dumpster can only be located on paved surfaces on the property for which the MZA is being submitted (not on City streets or blocking sidewalks).

•The permit expires after 30 days. If you are anticipating the need for an extension, it may be granted, but please contact the Planning Department before your 30 days expire.

•Make sure to notify your subdivision trustees and adjacent property owners of your intent to utilize a dumpster. You will be required to sign on the application form attesting that you have done so.

The application for Municipal Zoning Approval is available online at the City's website. Using the 'Document Center' tab, go to the 'Planning Department' dropdown under the 'Forms and Permits' columns. The Municipal Zoning Approval Application is on the second page of the 'Planning & Zoning Forms'.

Concrete Slab Replacement Program

The City will manage two concrete slab replacement projects in 2023. The first project will be a complete reconstruction of Wildhorse Parkway from Wild Horse Creek Road (MoDOT) to the Wildwood City Limits. The second project will reconstruct portions of Whitestone Farm Drive, Royalbrook Drive, and Woodland Field Court. These projects will replace approximately 32,500 square yards of concrete slabs. Residents adjacent to the planned replacement areas, along with subdivision trustees, will receive project notification by mail. Additionally, a project page will be placed on the City's website and regularly updated.

Did You Know?

Did you know the City inspectors rate each of the City's 183 miles of streets on a three-year cycle? These inspection results are used to create our multi-year capital replacement plan.

Litter

Please remember that it is a violation of City Code to litter or dump material of any kind on City streets, in City parks, or in any stream. City maintenance staff spends time each day picking up litter from City property. All litter which is not removed eventually finds its way, typically via storm sewers, to a City stream. Litter is not only unsightly, but it can be harmful to creek vegetation and aquatic life.



Asphalt Overlay Project

In 2023, the City will manage an asphalt overlay on North Goddard Avenue, Old Baxter Road and Old Olive Street Road (17,000 square yards). This project will provide a new two-inch asphalt driving surface. This project is currently scheduled for the summer of 2023.

Accessible Curb Ramps

Each year the City uses Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding from St. Louis County to construct Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant curb ramps. Over the last five years, the City has replaced 70 curb ramps through this program, at no cost to City residents. This year the City will use CDBG funds to replace curb ramps within the River Bend Estates Addition subdivision.



Did You Know?

The City has an Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Transition Plan. This includes data on all sidewalk and curb ramps located within the City. When any project is constructed that abuts a curb ramp, that ramp is reconstructed (if necessary) to comply with current ADA requirements. We have reconstructed 47 curb ramps in 2022.

Vector Control

Soon it will be spring, and the wet and warmer weather will bring us many of the things we love. Unfortunately, it will also bring about the return of mosquitoes. You can reduce the mosquito population by ensuring there are no areas of standing water around your home that allows mosquitoes to breed. Eliminating these areas is the single most effective means to reduce the mosquito population.

In Chesterfield, problems with mosquitoes are addressed via contract by St. Louis County Vector Control. St. Louis County Vector Control professionals provide both larviciding and adulticiding services within the City. Larviciding is conducted by treating known mosquito breeding sites with EPA registered mosquito larvicide. Adulticiding is accomplished by spraying using truck mounted Ultra-Low Volume (ULV) machines.

Residents that maintain beehives, or who do not want their property sprayed for other reasons, are able to request that their property be placed on a "No Spray" list. Additionally, residents can request to be notified via email when St. Levis Country Vector Control will be approxing in their area.

via email when St. Louis County Vector Control will be spraying in their area. Those who wish to be contacted via email, or placed on the "No Spray" list, can do so by contacting St. Louis County Vector Control at 314.615.0680. Residents may also contact the Vector Control "Spray Hotline" 314.615.4BUG (4284) to find the location of where adulticiding (spraying) will occur that evening.


Save the Date: Public Works Week is May 21-27

Sidewalk Projects for 2023

The City will manage two sidewalk replacement projects in 2023. The first project (Project A) will address more deficiencies in the following subdivisions: Wilson Farm, Chesterfield Meadows, Wilson Manor and Bent Tree. Prior to constructing Project A, the City will undertake a separate project to "mud-jack" deficient sidewalk slabs. This allows us to address more deficient sidewalk and only remove and replace those slabs absolutely necessary for the safety of pedestrians and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliance.

The second project (Project B) will address isolated sidewalk deficiencies throughout the City including those reported through the City's Work Order system.

Did You Know?

We maintain over 260 miles of public sidewalk. All sidewalks are inspected and rated on a three-year cycle. Deficiencies can be reported by contacting the City's customer service number at 636.537.4000 or by using the "Report a Problem" function on the City's website.



CITY HISTORY

The Forhan Family

Thomas Forhan (1835-1892) was born in Killarney, County Kerry, Ireland. The same year, Catherine Ash (1835-1908) was born in Cahersiveen, County Kerry, Ireland. Thomas and Catherine both emigrated through the Port of New York. Thomas in 1849 and Catherine in 1857. Thomas married Catherine in 1858 in Holyoke, Massachusetts. They had eight children. Eleanor (1861-1933) and Catherine (1863-1949) were born in Hartford, Connecticut. The family then moved to Buffalo, New York where their other children were born: John (1864-1933), Thomas (1866-1903), Michael (1869), twins Peter (1873-1875) and Edward (1873-1946) and Jennie (1877-1934). A baby picture was taken of Edward as his parents did not think he would survive. Instead, his twin brother passed away at two years of age. Two of Edward's brothers decided to seek their fortunes in the west and in 1918, Edward decided to follow. After failing to find any trace of his brothers between New York and Missouri, Edward stopped his search. He served in World War I in the 52nd Aero Squadron as a machinist, then made St. Louis County his home. He worked for Emerson Electric as a machinist. He married Alma Amalia Catharina Luedloff in 1923 and eight children followed in guick succession: Margaret (1924-2012), Violet "Drucilla" (1925-), Norman (1926-1982), Mary (1928-2017), Frances "Eileen" (1929-2017), Katherine (1931-2020), Eugene (1933-1974) and Viola (1934-2016). Drucilla Williams is the only surviving sibling.

Alma Amalia Catherina Luedloff (1899-1977) was the daughter of Johann "Balthasar" Luedoff (1853-1908) and Auguste Marie "Mary" Fey (1864-1905). The Luedloff family owned properties along Ladue, Warson, Olive and McKnight roads. In 1928, Alma bought property known as the Henry D. Schoettler Estate subdivision and Samuel Conway Estate subdivision in Chesterfield, Missouri. Her property is now Chesterfield Trails and Windsor Valley Court. In 1959 she sold 16 acres across Schoettler Road that became part of Maryknoll Catholic Seminary and now belongs to Logan University. Since a murder/suicide had occurred in the existing house on the property in the early 1900s, Alma had a new brick home built for her family along with a barn and other out buildings. The Forhans planted wheat and corn, had an apple and peach orchard, and grew blackberries and strawberries. Their livestock consisted of cows, a mule, a horse, chickens, ducks, geese, and pigs. The children attended Bellefontaine School on Conway Road.

In later life, Mary Forhan liked to reminisce with her granddaughter Jen Motz about her childhood on the Schoettler farm. She fondly recalled the cool sweet taste of water from a spring which ran through her parents' property. She also related how her brother Norman would hide her dolls and toys which she was unable to find. They finally materialized in a hollow tree when it was cut down. She lamented over the death of a pig she had been raising on her own. She routinely fed the animal table scraps and scraps from raw vegetables as they were being prepared. One day she fed her pig sugar snap peas and the next day it was dead. Anita told a story of her grandmother's geese who would listen to cars approaching on Schoettler Road and would get in the road and wait for the approaching car(s). The geese would take their time in retreating to the chagrin of motorists. Prior to marrying Ernest (Ernie) Cole (1922-2012) in 1951, Mary worked at Henry, Frank and Company – a stock exchange located in downtown St. Louis. Ernest was employed by Laclede Gas Company, worked at a gas station and drove a school bus for the Parkway School District. They purchased a house on three acres of land under the power lines on Schoettler Road near Mary's mother where they raised some sheep, chickens and cows and grew a kitchen garden. Their three children – Curtis E. (1952-2020), Anita L. (b. 1954) and Edward J. – helped around the farm and attended Parkway Schools -- Fern Ridge Elementary, Claymont Elementary, South Junior – Ed attended West Junior, and West High. According to Anita, a group of mischievous boys periodically set the Schoettler Road bridge on fire and one time blew up the mailbox of Edwin Mertz, a neighbor of Alma Forhan's.

Upon the death of Alma Forhan in 1977, her children sold her property to a subdivision developer. Four years later, Anita married Richard Motz (b. 1953) in St. John's Lutheran Church in Ellisville, Missouri. They have two children, Jennifer (b. 1985) and Richard, Jr. (b. 1987). Although Richard and Anita live in Wildwood today, Anita still has fond memories of growing up in Chesterfield.



Judges Needed for the April 4 County Election

In the upcoming April 4, 2023 General Municipal Election in St. Louis County, voters will be choosing candidates and deciding on ballot issues for various public entities. Election Judges and Student Election Judges are needed to administer such elections in Missouri.

The St. Louis County Election Board is accepting applications for people who are interested in serving as Election Judges for the April 4, 2023 election. Additionally, the Election Board has an excellent High School Student program that gives students an opportunity to work with veteran Election Judges providing hands on experience in learning how elections are conducted.

Election Judges play a pivotal role in making it possible for citizens to rightfully exercise the franchise on Election Day. A typical election may have approximately 65% of voters cast ballots on Election Day at over 200 polling places across St. Louis County. Election Judges set up the voting equipment at the polling location, manage the voting process, and secure the ballots for collection at the Election Board. They are truly the "backbone" of the electoral process.

Election Judges are awarded a financial stipend of \$280 for their service. Students may receive a stipend of \$170 or earn 16 community service hours.

Serving as an Election Judge gives citizens a chance to perform an important civic duty and allows them to actively participate in their community.


