

RESOLUTION NO. 116**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT
OF AN ERUV DISTRICT IN THE CITY OF CHESTERFIELD**

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Chesterfield:

FINDINGS

1. The ERUV committee of Tpheris Israel Chevra Kadisha Congregation has asked the permission of the City to establish an ERUV DISTRICT in Chesterfield in accordance with Jewish religious laws.
2. The boundaries of the proposed ERUV DISTRICT are to be the boundary lines of the City of Chesterfield as now established.
3. Establishment of the ERUV will allow the practice of "carrying" on the Sabbath and other Jewish holy days in accordance with Orthodox Jewish law.
4. Orthodox Jewish law requires that the city in which the ERUV is located provide a grant of permission to establish the ERUV district for a nominal consideration.
5. The ERUV committee has requested that the City of Chesterfield rent to the ERUV committee, for one United States dollar, the rights to the domain within the ERUV district for the sole purpose of "carrying" on the Sabbath and other Jewish holy days in accordance with Orthodox Jewish law.

CONCLUSION

1. The City Council finds it to be in the public interest that those residents of Chesterfield of the Jewish faith for whom this request has been presented be granted the rights requested and likewise deems it to be of no detriment to the rights and general welfare of other members of the public.
2. The City Council does hereby grant to the ERUV Committee the rights requested for a period of 99 years and authorizes the establishment of an ERUV DISTRICT having as its boundaries the boundary lines of the City of Chesterfield, as now established at a rental of One United States dollar (\$1.00), in hand paid, in order to define the Sabbath bounds in accordance with Orthodox Jewish Law.
